VVPAT -- Not a Reliable Ballot

DRE printouts continually fail in recent elections and tests.

Printout errors, paper jams, running out of ink, and more, it's just not a sensible solution.

2007 Secretary of State's "Top to Bottom Review" of Voting Systems

Printouts don't always match selections on the screen;

Printouts can be destroyed during the election by use of a simple household substance without causing voter suspicion.

California: 2006.

Votes reversed on printouts; Paper jammed, long lines; Paper ran out, long lines; Ink ran out;

2007 New Jersey Institute of Technology Tests

When printer errors were fixed by turning the machine off and back on, the printer finishes printing in a different size and UPSIDE DOWN.

Of 1200 test votes, 56 printouts (4.7%) were lost due to printer jams.

2007 Rice University Doctoral Dissertation

Over 60% of voters did not notice errors, even entire races missing, when reviewing their ballots on a DRE.

Ohio: 2006.

Votes omitted on printouts;
Votes reversed on printouts;
Printouts didn't print;
Paper jammed;
Paper rolled too far, hid 2 races;
Paper slipped on roll;
Paper stuck, quit rolling;
Paper ran out

Washington State: 2006.

Paper jammed, was unreadable

Utah: 2006. Votes reversed on printouts

Illinois: 2006.

Votes reversed on printouts; Paper jammed

North Carolina: 2006.

Paper ran out

Arkansas: 2006.

Errors on printouts; Paper jammed, long lines
